Service Description

The Integrated Community Centre for Mental Wellness (ICCMW) provides one-stop, districtbased and comprehensive community mental health support services for discharged mental patients, persons with suspected mental health problems, their families/carers and residents living in Kowloon City District

Our Mission

- Our motto is "Mental Wellness is Everyone's Concern".
- We adopt a positive and de-stigmatizing approach to promote the importance of mental wellness, and
- To remove barriers to mental health service for residents living in Kowloon City District

Service objectives

- To provide community-based and outreaching support services for KC residents with the need in mental health services
- To raise public awareness of the importance of mental wellness

- To enhance families/ carers' knowledge of mental illness and coping abilities in taking care of their families with mental health problem
- To adopt the principles of recovery approach to render individualized and person-centered intervention in order to develop members' strengths and induce hope in their lives

Target Group

Members include the following persons aged 15 and above:

- Discharged mental patients/ out-patients of psychiatric hospitals/ clinics
- Persons with, or suspected to have mental health problems
- Family member/carers of the above persons
- Local residents with interest in improving their mental health
- Residents with mental health problems or suspected mental health problems living in the private residential care homes for persons with disabilities

Scope of Services

- Drop-in services
- Outreaching services
- Casework counseling
- Therapeutic and supportive group work services
- Networking services, including social and recreational activities
- Day training
- Outreaching occupational therapy training services
- Public education programs on mental health
- Referral to the Community Psychiatric Service of the Hospital Authority for clinical assessment or psychiatric treatment

Three-tiered Case Management Model

Casework

Therapeutic Groups

Interest Class/ Skills Training Psycho-educational & Mental Wellness Program Primary Intervention: Training Program and Psycho-education

Outreaching Occupational Assessment/ Training:

- Work attitude enhancement
- Occupational skills training
- Health management training
- Self-care skills training
- Home management skills training
- Community skills training

Primary Intervention: Training Program and Psycho-education

Interest Class and Supportive Group

- Interest classes: home decoration, handicrafts, calligraphy, origami, cooking, magic, chess
- Sports: yoga, dancing, ball games, hiking, cycling
- Supportive groups: stress coping and mutual support for family members/ carers

Primary Intervention: Training Program and Psycho-education

Psycho-education and Mental Wellness Program

- Talks, seminars and workshops on mental wellness, positive psychology
- Mental Health Ambassador Program
- Volunteer work to deprived groups, those in need and the community
- Social inclusion programs with youths, adults and the elderly

Secondary Intervention: Therapeutic Group

Therapeutic groups

Implemented by social workers/ clinical psychologist, including :

- Cognitive Behavioral Therapy
- Satir Model
- Horticultural therapy
- Narrative Therapy
- Art and Music Therapy
- Positive Psychology

Case Management Services

Case Management Services

- Case managers are composed of social workers, occupational therapist and psychiatric nurse
- Case managers will deliver assessment and formulate individualized care plans for recovery
- Intervention approach includes pre-discharged case assessment, re-admitted case follow-up, outreaching contacts, home visits and utilization of ICCMW programs and facilities

Case Management Model

- Case managers deliver as much of the "help" or service as possible, rather than making referrals to multiple formal services
- Natural community resources are the primary partners: case manager works with informal support such as family, landlords, employers, neighbors
- Work in the community: outreach mode to enhance engagement, allow more complete and accurate assessments

Case Management Model

- Individual and team case management works: increases availability of someone who knows the person
- Case managers have primary responsibility for a person's services: enhance responsibility for critical decisions
- Case managers should foster choice and selfdetermination

Case Management Assessment

Assessment tools

- General Health Questionnaire" and "Brief Symptoms Inventory" for preliminary assessment of the mental health condition of members for identification of suspected case with mental illness, and for early prevention of relapse
- Brief Psychiatric Rating Scale will be adopted under supervision of clinical psychologist for assessment whenever necessary
