a. Nursing Home for the Elderly

- ☐ Equivalent to C/A & Nursing Home of HK
- □ Welfare-based facility with more welfare staff than medical staff
- provides continuous nursing care
- Assessment of physical & mental conditions is necessary prior to admission
- ☐ Co-payment with Insurance: Residents bear 10% of fee and meal cost.
- ☐ Long waiting time due to shortage
- Planning process: part of the Gold Plan of Japan (target 360,000 beds in 2004)
- Cost of construction: State-50%; Perfectual Gov't-25%; Agency 25%



b. Health Care Facilitiesfor the Elderly

- Designed as half way houses between hospital and community
- For elders whose medical condition has become stable and rehabilitation is required
- Residents usu. Stay for short periods like 6 months
- Assessment of health conditions before admission
- Gold Plan: expected increase will be less than that of community services



c. Long Term Care Beds in Geriatric Hospitals (Medical Care Facility)

- Equivalent to infirmary of H K
- Medical facility in nature (hospitals), more medical than welfare staff
- For seriously impaired elders who are waiting for admission into nursing home or health care facilities. Due to shortage of such, these elders are stuck in hospitals.
- Provides long term daily medical treatment, extended rehabilitation or nursing care

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
