- provides day, residential & community services for persons with intellectual disabilities
- in 1997, extends services to persons with psychiatric disabilities



Services for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities

- Day Training and Vocational Rehabilitation Service – Day Activity Center, Workshop/Integrated Vocational Rehabilitation Center, Supported Employment.
- 2) Residential Service Care & Attention Home, Hostels..
- 3) Community Support Service District Support Center for Persons with Disabilities (DSC), residential respite services, Holiday Care etc..



Services for Persons with Psychiatric Disabilities

 Workshop/Integrated Vocational Rehabilitation Center,

- 2) Residential Service Halfway Houses

Assumptions

- Parents know their children best, expert in taking care of them
- Parents are resourceful in managing their children
- Partnership relation ie. Advocacy,
 Consultation
- Residential Care is not a substitute for family care



Practice

- Individual Rehabilitation Development Plan (IRDP) Case Management Approach –
 - collect expectations and needs of clients and their parents/ family members

 link up resources to help the clients and their parents / family members to develop the potentials and meet their needs



 parents/ family members presented in the IRDP case conference to give views. Get consensus before formulation of IRDP.

 case and progress reports, meeting minutes will be given to parents / family members for monitoring.



IRDP Case Management Approach in DAC cum Hostel Two Social Workers as Case Managers of 50 service users.

Scope of Responsibility of IRDP case manager

- IRDP chairperson
- Social Work Caseworker (including challenging behaviors)
- Supporting and Supervising PWs (DAC and Hostel) in the planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of IRDP.



2) Parents participated in the Management

2.1) Agency level – Chairman of each Regional Management Sub-committee (RMS) appointed to be the Management Committee members.

2.2)Regional level – parent representatives of service units formed the Regional Management Sub-committee.
The Chairman is elected by members.



2.3) Service Unit level –

- 2.3.1) Service unit has its own parents group meeting or Parent Committee. Parents elect their representatives to be the RMS members.
- 2.3.2) other groups /committee formed to give advice to service unit: 膳食小組、安全及服務質素委員會 etc..

Achievements

1) Better understandings to the family, greatest benefits to the client

2) Increased satisfaction of care

3) Consolidated mutual trust

4) Transparency in service provisions



Limitations

1) View on the disabled individual than the family as a whole

2) Draw resources from family to help the disabled individual, may neglect family needs.

3) Refer out to IFSC if statutory/complicated problems or multiple needs encountered



Suggestions

1) Staff development for enhancement of systemic and strength perspectives

 Explore possibility to re-integrate the services to provide family service for families with disabled individual
