A Coordinated Approach

Progress(last two decades since 2000, UN)

- Governments' obligation under international laws and agreements to punish and prevent violence against women
- medical, legal, counseling and protection services
- changes of norms, laws, policies and practices
- advocacy, education and training efforts

New Agenda, New Measure, Action & Advocacy (1)

Governments should:

- Have comprehensive policy
- Define all forms of violence against women as illegal criminal behaviors
- Prosecute perpetrators
- collect & announce figures & trends

New Agenda, New Measure, Action & Advocacy (2)

- Protect through legislation
- Establish family tribunal
- Launch zero tolerance campaign
- Strengthen public education
- Ensure perpetrators and victims receive proper education and counseling programme




Strengthening **Prevention, Protection & Justice and Support**


- Community and school education

- A system of networks, agreements, processes ad applied principles created by local shelters movement, criminal justice agencies, and human services programs

Not a Minute More...

Governments must:

- commit the resources necessary to make change possible (commitment)
- adopt frameworks to prevent, punish and prosecute violence (interagency coordinated approach)
- use sound framework or action plan (implementation)

Action plan

- Clear benchmarks and indicators of actions
- Structured accountable monitoring system
- ⇒ Transparent and accessible
- ⇒ Community voices
